About EMC

Kerala Government has became the first State Government in India to establish an Energy Management Centre (EMC) at State level, aiming primarily to remould and instrumentalise energy sector as a catalyst in promoting a development process which is econo-ecologically sustainable. With a view to making energy sector achieve such a lead and catalytic role, EMC has evolved a novel and comprehensive energy management approach and institutional philosophy encompassing management of energy technology systems - both conventional and non-conventional, energy conservation in all sectors of the economy, energy resource management, rural and urban energy systems, energy education and training, energy generation and conservation - based employment and poverty alleviation programmes. Giving consideration to this energy-economy interaction process/scenario, the Government of Kerala took leadership initiatives for establishing a multi-disciplinary Energy Management Centre under the Department of Power.

About BEE

Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE) is a statutory body under the Ministry of Power, Government of India. It assists in developing policies and strategies with the primary objective of reducing the energy intensity of the Indian economy. The agency's function is to develop programs which will increase the conservation and efficient use of energy in India. BEE coordinates with designated consumers, designated agencies, and other organization to identify and utilize the existing resources and infrastructure, in performing the functions assigned to it under the EC Act. The mission of Bureau of Energy Efficiency is to institutionalise energy efficiency services, enable delivery mechanisms in the country and provide leadership to energy efficiency in all sectors of the country. The primary objective would be to reduce energy intensity in the economy.

About CED

The Centre for Environment and Development (CED) is an autonomous research and development, training and consultancy organisation focussing in fields related to Environment and Development. Its main objectives are to carry out research on subjects related to environment and development and to serve as an institution of higher learning, to interact/collaborate with Universities, R&D institutions Developmental agencies in India and abroad for research on environment and sustainable development, technology innovation and transfer of technology, to provide scientific and technological support to implement developmental projects of Local Self Government Institutions and other agencies, to carryout capacity building, training and outreach programs for different target groups, to provide consultancy services to government and multi-lateral agencies, to provide support on policy formulation to various tiers of governments and to develop databases and information systems specific areas related to environment and development.

She is Convenor, Science Forum, Maharaja's College Ernakulam and Resource person of URJAKIRAN awareness campaigns from 2019.
